*Château Liversan*

*Haut-Médoc*

Located in the area of Saint Sauveur next to Pauillac, the vineyard has included Château Liversan and Château Fonpiqueyre since the XVIIIth century.

The soil made of gravel limestone on a chalk subsoil acts as a filter favouring the vines' roots. Classified as Cru Bourgeois in 1932 this estate was formerly owned by the Marquis de Latresne at the XVIIIth century and by the Prince Guy de Polignac from 1984 until the take over by the Lapalu family. The rather feminine character of these wines is expressed through rich tannins although strongly structured and with a great aromatic complexity.

**Area of the vineyard:**

Located within a larger estate of 130.9 acres (53 hectares of vineyards ) Château Liversan has a surface area of 96 acres (30 hectares).

**Production:**

180 000 bottles.

**Type of soil:**

Thin gravel in a chalk subsoil.

**Grapes varieties:**

50 % Cabernet Sauvignon, 40 % Merlot, 5 % Cabernet Franc, 5 % Petit Verdot.

**Average quantity per hectare:**

7000.

**Average age of the vineyards:**

25 years

**Wine-making process:**

In stainless steel vats. Each vat has its own temperature control system. Long vatting for 3 or 4 weeks

**Ageing:**

In oak barrels made with oak from the Allier region (25% to 30% of new barrels every year).
